Laboratory:

- **Prospective trial to determine if minimizing the number of times we look at embryos will improve their development**

Who may be eligible?

- **Women ages 18-40 having in vitro fertilization (IVF)**
- **Patients having a Day 5 transfer after IVF**
- **Patients willing to provide informed written consent**

Participants will be randomized into 2 groups. Embryos from the control group will be looked at according to current procedure. The study group's embryos will have 2 less observations.
